2. Cold to Cosy



With recent fresh snowfall outside and sub-zero temperatures overnight, many homes in South Lakeland could benefit from the range of small and medium scale interventions that <u>Cumbria Action for Sustainability (CAfS)</u> can provide for free through their <u>Cold to Cosy service</u>.

The <u>eligibility criteria are very broad</u> and includes anyone receiving child benefit, Universal Credit, suffering from a

range of health conditions or living in specific circumstances. Individuals can <u>refer</u> <u>themselves</u> or <u>others</u>. Consultations are taking place over the phone due to the current lockdown and free energy-saving equipment, that includes energy saving light bulbs, radiator reflectors, letterbox covers and chimney balloons or sheep are still being distributed.

3. Public Spaces Protection Orders

SLDC is reviewing the district's <u>Public Spaces</u> <u>Protection Orders</u> (PSPOs) which were granted under <u>section 59 of the Antisocial Behaviour (ASB)</u>, <u>Crime and Policing Act 2014</u> to allow authorised council officers and the police to introduce new measures to tackle antisocial behaviour and to improve public safety in a defined area.

PSPOs in the district can be found on our website <u>here</u>, alongside further information <u>here</u>. Associated Local Government Associate guidance for councils can be found <u>here</u>.

In addition, we are consulting on a number of new **PSPOs that are proposed** due to recent complaints about anti-social behaviour, some of which would restrict the lighting of barbecues and fires in certain areas. As you will see in the questionnaire we are targeting sports pitches as these seem to have caused the most concerns.

We are also offering the opportunity for your councils to consider your own PSPOs.

There is no charge to parish councils to apply for these protections or to bring them into law under the PSPO. Some examples of where these restrictions may be appropriate include children's play areas and playing fields that are owned by the parish council. As part of the application process Parish Councils will need to be able to justify to SLDC that there is a clear need to introduce a specific protection. This will involve parish councils holding a six week consultation with the constituents of the parish and providing an analysis of the results. 4. Member Locality Budget Scheme

Each SLDC Councillor has £1,000 to use for projects in their ward areas this financial year. Approximately one quarter have allocated all of their budget, but a further quarter have some budget remaining and almost half of councillors have yet to allocate any of their fund. If you are looking for funding for a local initiative that is in keeping with <u>SLDC's priorities</u> then do consider contacting your <u>local Ward Councillors</u>.

5. My Account



<u>My Account</u> is the **new way to report or request a whole range of council services**, **contact us or check information**. It is part of SLDC's commitment to make it easier for our residents to access services 24 hours a day, seven days a week, at a time that suits them.

Registering for an account is easy and takes just a couple of minutes – all you need is an email address. Got to <u>www.southlakeland.gov.uk/Myaccount</u> to login or register.

Please pass on these details to local residents who can use the service to report everything from missed bins to fly-tipping, broken playground equipment to abandoned vehicles. They can also apply for services that range from postal votes to replacement bins, and make payments that include parking fines and council tax. More services are being added all the time alongside information tailored to the resident's area that include local planning applications, bin collections calendars and local councillor contact details.

6. The Greening Campaign

South Lakeland District Council are supporting communities within our area to join a movement of villages and towns across the country tackling Climate Change. People are often asking 'what do we do about Climate Change'?, or 'What is the point if no-one else is doing anything?' and so this is an opportunity to meet that challenge with help, support and a structure to move through.

The initiative is called <u>The Greening Campaign</u> and has already been run by over 200 communities in the UK. We already have some* in South Lakeland who have taken the first steps to be part of this initiative. The campaign supports communities through a structured process, enabling them to become more sustainable,



looking at things like community engagement, retrofit of houses, and rewilding. It provides expert advice and support, along with information packs, to help each community through this process. So all you need to get started is the desire to create a Greening community and to have some fun along the way. Everyone, of all ages, is welcome to take part.

Now we're looking for communities of between 250 and 8000 households in South Lakeland who want to take up the offer to be a Greening Campaign.
